In that letter it said to contact the administration, which I did, Amy Johnson, who just said, "you shouldn't have been admitted in the first place," with no explanation. 18 months, or so, later, I am told, by Mr. Munch that the letter was accidentally and automatically sent out by the system. Why would I get a letter of rejection then, but not any other times? The point of this email is to get information on WHY I was rejected. Mr. Munch only said they voted no and that's it. I asked Amy Johnson and she said ask Ms. Bevelhymer. I ask Ms. Bevelhymer and she just attached the email I received from Mr. Munch. I would like to know WHY the committee rejected me. Usually, in any other institution, when you are denied admission, or anything else, they tell you why. So, will one of you three please either tell me why, or point me in the proper direction on why the petition was denied? I have emailed Ms. Bevelhymer at least 3 times inquiring about this and have gotten no answer, so will some one please send me official documents stating why, or an email or smoke signal or something? This is getting tiring at this point that no one can give a straight answer, except for Amy Johnson when she flat out said I "shouldn't have been admitted in the first place." Although she never said why. So can some one please let me know what happened. Thank you.

The score was enough to satisfy my requirements for a provisional admittance at WSU, which was granted then revoked for no reason. Given the fact that I applied to WSU, with the score necessary for my written acceptance letter, then unjustly denied, forced me to apply to another University which required a higher score. In order to get a higher score i must re-take the test. Had I'd failed and not scored high enough to satisfy the required score AT WSU, which I did satisfy, then I'd understand not being granted the compensation. With regards to the books, I spent money on books for courses that I was told, by Amy Johnson, that "I shouldn't have been allowed to take." Then denied future registration before the provisional time period was over shows that I was targeted as well as had my requirements changed in the 11th of 15 weeks. Had I'd been denied from the beginning, I wouldn't have purchased the books. Had I'd been given the chance to finish the semester with the original requirements I would've earned a 3.14, which is higher than the 3.0 that was the minimum for a provisional admission. Also, had they told me they wanted a 3.25 gpa or greater for the first semester, I wouldn't have taken FIVE graduate classes, I would've taken two or three. Finally, had I'd not been collateral damage because of whatever internal drama there's been between the business college and the old director, Mike Evans, everything would be fine, I'd be currently taking two summer classes and all would be well. The fact that all WSU has been doing is manipulating the rules to specifically keep me out has been annoying enough, then to be told I shouldn't have been admitted by Amy Johnson, as well as had the requirements changed before the semester is over supports my conclusion that I've been targeted to be rejected. I'd rather not take this to court but if your administration can't see the blatant post admission bias, then I'm sure a judge will. Please let me know if you've reconsidered. Otherwise I plan on filing a claim against the University on Monday and have subpoenas for everyone involved. Maybe the president will finally address this directly instead of putting it aside like everyone else has. With the sole exception of Mr. Sol Solomon who has been very helpful trying to mediate the situation, that the business college initiated, as well as help me figure out a way to drop classes to get the 3.25. But given the timeframe, it was IMPOSSIBLE, to do anything but petition for withdraw and refund, which isn't even what I wanted to do. Wasting 4 months and not working didn't help my family nor

my career ambitions, again, given the fact that the business college purposely changed my admission. It is specifically because of that purposeful manipulation and revocation of the original admission is why I believe I'm owed compensation for my books, my parking pass, the unjust late fee, as well as the cost of the GMAT. Please let me know what decision you come to given my empirical experiences with the hell it's been dealing with your University. Honestly I wish Wright Patterson Air Force Base never recommended attending your University, this has been the worst experience with an alleged professional entity I've ever delt with. I do not recommend anyone attending the college of business whatsoever.

You petitioned for admission to the MBA program on 3/11/13. Your scores were as follows: Undergraduate GPA – 2.3, GMAT score – 410, Index – 870. We require the following minimum scores for conditional admission to our program: Undergraduate GPA of 2.5, GMAT score of 400, Index of 900. Regular admission to our program requires that your Index score be at least 1100. You did not meet the minimum scores to be admitted on a regular or conditional status to our program. However, our Associate Dean of Graduate Programs reviewed your petition on 4/1/13 and set the following conditions: you were required to earn a 3.25 GPA in spring 2013.
