


Mr. Jackson was wrongfully imprisoned for more than 39 years making him the longest serving exoneree in United States history. However, to simplify the fifty percent calculation, Mr. Jackson requests payment pursuant to ORC §2743.48(B)(3) in the amount of \$1,012,080.81, which is fifty percent of 39 years flat and does not account for additional months, which must be prorated according to ORC §2743.48(E)(2)(b). Mr. Jackson's request for \$1,012,080.81 comes with the understanding that prorated payment for his additional months of wrongful imprisonment will be added to his total judgment for damages upon the conclusion of his case.

Accordingly, Jackson respectfully moves this Court to order the Clerk's Office to forward the preliminary judgment for the sum of \$1,012,080.81 to the controlling board immediately so that Mr. Jackson's matter can be added to the agenda at the next meeting of the controlling board.

The undersigned counsel has also sent a letter to the Clerk's Office requesting the office to proceed with its statutorily mandated duty. A copy of that letter, dated February 20, 2015, is attached to this motion, along with a proposed Entry for disbursement of the funds.



JOURNAL ENTRY APPROVING DISBURSEMENT OF 50% OF THE SUM DESCRIBED IN ORC §2743.48(E)(2)(b)

The Court, being fully advised as to the premises, approves and confirms the preliminary judgment and disbursement of 50% of the sum described in ORC §2743.48(E)(2)(b), for 39 years of Mr. Jackson’s wrongful imprisonment but not inclusive of prorated payments for additional months beyond the 39 yeas.

The partial settlement warrant shall be drawn on the account of the State of Ohio for the sum of One Million, Twelve Thousand, Eighty and 81/100 Dollars (\$1,012,080.81) payable to “Michele L. Berry, Attorney at Law, IOLTA for payment to Ricky Jackson for the funding of a non-qualified money market account or the purchase of an annuity contract for the benefit of Ricky Jackson for damages for physical injury caused by wrongful imprisonment.” This warrant shall be sent in care of Michele L. Berry at 114 East 8th Street, Cincinnati, OH 45202.

Dear Clerk of Courts:

Pursuant to Ohio Revised Code ORC §2743.48(B)(3),¹ I am requesting the Clerk's Office to forward a preliminary judgment to the president of the controlling board requesting the payment to Ricky Jackson of fifty percent of the amount described in ORC §2743.48(E)(2)(b).

The Cuyahoga County Court of Common Pleas entered a judgment finding Mr. Jackson a wrongfully imprisoned individual on February 11, 2015. This entry was filed with the Court of Claims today, February 20, 2015, when Mr. Jackson filed his Complaint initiating his lawsuit against the State of Ohio.

Mr. Jackson was wrongfully imprisoned for more than 39 years making him the longest serving exoneree in United States history. ¹ ORC § 2743.48(B)(3) reads: Within sixty days after the date of the entry of a court of common plea's determination that a person is a wrongfully imprisoned individual, the clerk of the court of claims shall forward a preliminary judgment to the president of the controlling board requesting the payment of fifty per cent of the amount described in division (E)(2)(b) of this section to the wrongfully imprisoned individual. The board shall take all actions necessary to cause the payment of that amount out of the emergency purposes special purpose account of the board.


the next meeting of the controlling board.
